BOISE -- The Idaho Heritage Trust Board of Trustees is pleased to announce \$69,683 in grants to help communities preserve the historic buildings, artifacts and historic sites. Over \$64,000 was awarded at a meeting in Boise November 10. Grants totaling \$5333 were awarded in September of 2009.

The AVISTA Corporate Fund for North Idaho supports grants in their service area. The AVISTA grants were awarded to the Panida Theater in Sandpoint and the Bunker Hill Staff House Museum in Kellogg.

Founded in 1989, the Idaho Heritage Trust began as a lasting legacy of the Centennial Celebration in 1990. Funds generated by the red, white and blue license plate support historic preservation throughout Idaho. Fifty cents from each standard Idaho plate goes into the endowment fund. The interest from the fund, in partnership with money from local communities, supports historic buildings, sites and artifact collections throughout Idaho.
