Technical Assistance

Over the past year, the Trust provided a variety of technical services totaling \$46,841 to address Idaho's need for professional architectural, conservation, and archaeological assistance in rural preservation. Examples of technical assistance from this year include:

St. Joseph's Mission, Slickpoo

Dedicated on September 8, 1874 under the guidance of Father Cataldo for the Nez Perce Tribe, this church is all that remains of the original mission complex. The Trust provided a complete architectural and structural building assessment for the National Park Service to assist with plans for restoration.



Bear River Massacre Site, Preston

January 29, 1863, the US Army's California Volunteers, under the command of Colonel Patrick E. Connor led an attack against the Northwestern Shoshone Indians resulting in the largest massacre of Native Americans in the history of our country. Chief Sagwitch, surviving the battle, later led the survivors to become baptized Mormons and farmers, and were never placed on a reservation. The Northwest Band of the Shoshone Nation has acquired portions of the battle site to develop a cultural interpretive center. The Trust provided funding to the Idaho State Historical Society in collaboration with the Shoshone Nation to assist with archaeological and geomorphological investigations.

Grant Awards

The Trust awarded \$127,184 in matching funds to 37 projects across Idaho to preserve historic buildings, sites, and artifacts. An increase of \$22,000 from last year's total and an additional nine projects will receive assistance this year. In 2014, the Trust funded \$99,770 towards grants awarded in previous years. Highlights of completed projects include:

Corliss Steam Engine, Museum of North Idaho, Coeur d'Alene
The 75-ton 1000 horsepower
Corliss steam engine was installed in 1916 at the Edward
Rutledge Timber Company on the shores of Lake Coeur
d'Alene. The flywheel turned
78-100 revolutions per minute and furnished power to drive the sawmill until 1963 when it was converted to electric power.
Portia Club, Payette





The Portia Club is a historic women's clubhouse, founded in 1895 to discuss literature and "improve the cultural well being of their community". The ladies started the Payette City Library, funded Children's Free Health Clinics, organized the Apple Blossom Festival, and

sponsored lectures on laws that affected women and children. Following 6 years of fundraising, in 1927, they constructed their own clubhouse. Today the Ladies Club is restoring their original clubhouse and still contribute to their community.

Surgeon's Quarters, Fort Boise, Boise

Fort Boise was constructed in 1863 as a cavalry fort by the US Army during the Civil War and intended to protect both miners and the interests of the US Government in transporting gold/silver to fund the war efforts. The Surgeon's Quarters was restored this past year in a partnership between the



Veteran's Administration, Preservation Idaho, local architects, archaeologists, artists, retailers, the University of Idaho and with technical assistance and grant funding from IHT.
